

DAVID HUFF BIOGRAPHY

David Huff was born in a 3-room shack in Pineville, Mississippi. At an early age, David developed a keen appreciation for country and truly soulful music being influenced by his daddy's guitar. David learned to "sense and feel" the music in the world around him from the raw grit of early southern rock to the moody, mournful cries of the blues.

He started playing guitar and singing country music at 11 years old. He and his sister Dorothy played on a local radio station and the Louisiana Hayride – backed by Elvis' drummer, D.J. Fontana.

David formed a rock band "David & The Giants" when he was 18 years old. The band was signed with Capitol Records and Rick Hall in Muscle Shoals. Their songs "Ten Miles High" and "Super Love" were popular in England.

David signed a solo contract with MGM records and from there with United Artist Records. David & The Giants opened for Styx, Cheech & Chong and Black Oak Arkansas. Their drummer Keith Thibodeaux was the former "Little Ricky" of the "I Love Lucy Show". David was in the studio with the Rolling Stones, Rod Stewart and Stevie Wonder.

In 1974 Keith was the first of the group to have an experience with the Lord. In 1977 Rayborn, Clayborn and David were born again. The group has toured for many years and recently traveled to the Philippines. There are also plans to tour England, Ireland and France next year.

Since 2000 David has recorded 6-solo projects with radio hits like "My Song of Praise" and "You Saved My Life". David also owns a recording studio where he has recorded a vast array of artists.
